
Additional Ideas/Games

- Put the handwriting page in a plastic sheet protector so that your child can use a dry erase marker to trace the letters more than one time
- Use the letter cards to play *Memory*
- Use the letter cards and the picture cards to play matching games uppercase to lowercase; letter sound to picture
- Find things in your home (at the park, etc.) that start with different letters; things of different colors
- Use the letter cards to identify letters in random order
- Make number and sight word flash cards for games
- Build letters and numbers using Play-Doh
- Practice using a computer mouse














BHCA Inc. Incoming Kindergarten Expectations

ELA/Reading/Writing Skills:

- 1. Recite the alphabet (sung or spoken)
- 2. Recognize 25% or more of upper and lowercase letters
- 3. Recognize own written name and individual letters in name
- 4. Recognize if two given words rhyme
- 5. Differentiate a letter from a number, shape, or word
- 6. Identify some letter sounds
- 7. Familiar with writing slanted lines, straight lines, and circular lines
- 8. Recognize some sight words

Math Skills:

- 1. Count to 10
- 2. Identify 11 colors
- 3. Identify basic shapes
- 4. Identify numbers 0-10
- 5. Sort like items
- 6. Count five objects with 1-to-1 correspondence

Social/Developmental Skills:

- 1. Use a tissue to blow nose and wash hands
- 2. Proper sneeze etiquette
- 3. Successfully manipulate zippers, buttons, belts, shoelaces
- 4. Independently perform sanitary needs and use proper bathroom etiquette (including proper aim and process of redressing and hand washing)
- 5. Follow 2-step instructions
- 6. Sit with sustained attention without interrupting for 5 or more minutes
- 7. Exhibit proper pencil grip
- 8. Use glue and scissors correctly
- 9. Separate from parents easily
- 10. Clean up after self
- 11. Show responsibility for personal items
- 12. Knows personal information: first and last name, birthday, address
- 13. Show respect to adults
